

## LIRIAN MILITARY COMMAND SAYS END OF WAR IN SIGHT!

After over a year of intense violence, a Lirian military affairs official has reported that a conclusion to the war is drawing closer. The deployment of advanced Lirian technologies and the strategic prowess of Her Majesty's armed forces has led the brave men and women who serve our national interests to strike a series of crushing blows against the Venkess aggressors. Experts predict that the worst of the fighting should be finished by the first snow, at the latest. The news comes, no doubt, as a tremendous relief and sign of hope to the beleaguered people of Acria who have suffered greatly at the hands of the invading armies. Kuru began his military career in the Yoban Peninsula prior to Lirian occupation where he devised the terms of the Jhandihari withdrawal from the peninsula when faced with overwhelming

## Life Across the Continent

### Part II: Life of the Xingsol

One of the more misunderstood cultures in Talus, the Xingsol people are often perceived as downtrodden, begrudgingly serving a single potentate. To agree with this view would do a disservice to a varied and dynamic nation whose culture evolved to reflect a careful balance between duty and pride.

The Xingsol are a people who take great pride in their place in the world. This is most pronounced in their innermost provinces, where it is as if there was a common understanding between every person in this land as to the way that the world should operate. From the simplest farmer to the wealthiest bureaucrat, everyone has a place within the grand design of their Emperor, whose wisdom carries the heart of their nation through strife into prosperity. Even in the outermost provinces, where slave-trading and great cruelty is common, craftsmen take pride in their handiwork and each tribesperson serves with utmost loyalty to their leader.

The Xingsol nation is divided into many provinces, each of which is managed in the Emperor's name by a magistrate. In the heart of the country, closer to the Emperor's palace, a very strict and elaborate bureaucracy has grown up. Each tier of government answers directly to the one above, starting from the


local bailiff up through the provincial magistrate until everything makes it way into the court of the Emperor.

The government of the borderlands differs greatly from this very orderly system. While they owe fealty to the Emperor and magistrates are appointed by the Emperor's court, the actual work of governing the communities is left to local chieftains and warlords. These men and women rule the Xingsol of the outer provinces by fear and force, and are given a great deal of autonomy by the bureaucracy of the central provinces.

Universally, however, Xingsol people are very mindful of law and painstakingly respect the word of law. If you encounter a Xingsol in your community who seems to act out of sorts, take the time to explain your local laws and the punishments meted out for breaking them. You may find them much more agreeable once they understand the law of the land

and its consequences. Some communities lean heavily towards certain trades, such as farming or silk harvesting, which means that the majority of the locals, their slaves and their bondsmen will work in one way or another with that trade. Because of this, craftsmen and laborers take pride in their work, as

this is a reflection of their community and each Xingsol identifies very strongly with their town or tribe. This is reflected most in the quality of craftsmanship found throughout this nation. Every village has beautifully-carved woodwork, colorful silks, magnificent stonework and finely-crafted manacles.

One of their most misunderstood cultural traits is their apparent desire to please others. This behavior is often perceived as submissive or servile. They do not seek to serve others, but rather to impress them so as to bring favor to their community. Due to the hierarchical nature of their government, once a community has gained the favor of a local administrator or tribal chieftain, they can count on their prolonged favor over that of neighboring communities. Should that administrator then impress the court of the Emperor with this community, even greater favor

will follow. Therefore, locals will strive to impress strangers on the chance that they are able to bring favor to their community, especially foreigners whose place in the bureaucracy is unknown. After all, you may be a simple traveler or a foreign dignitary from a far-away land, so they will afford you the same courtesies either way.

The best way to gain respect from Xingsol people is to honor their ways and show admiration for everything they present to you. Too often are Xingsol criticized for their perceived lack of personal impress or freedom, something that please others. This behavior is often perceived as society. Respect their place within their culture, show gratitude and admiration for all they provide you and you will find yourself the object of their attention and favor.
